Barbara Austin, RVi Planning + Landscape Architecture, Austin TX
Barbara is RVi's Principal-in-Charge of Park and Greenway Design at the Mueller Airport Redevelopment in Austin, Texas. Mueller is an urban infill project leading the way as a model for sustainable community design. A major focus of the project has been to establish a large scale native ecosystem woven into the urban fabric. The project is part of the LEED for Neighborhood Design pilot program.

Chris Brown, Civil Engineer, Port of Los Angeles

After many years in the study and planning stages, ground broke this past January on a 30 acre waterfront buffer project intended to bring recreation areas separation from shipping cargo containers and beautify the area. A companion project in San Pedro is also underway. Both are being built with sustainable practices. How these practices are shaping the development and how they will benefit the participants and the City will be discussed.

Calvin Abe, AHBE Landscape Architects, Los Angeles

Sustainability is a key consideration in all of the projects of AHBE Landscape Architects. Working in the Southern California climate for more than two decades with the aim of reconnecting people to nature has led to many lessons learned. The incorporation of sustainable landscape strategies in the public realm will be demonstrated through project presentations.
